I William Branch Campbell of Armington in the Colony of New South Wales Gentleman do hereby revoke all former Wills and Testamentary dispositions made by me and declare this to be my last Will and Testament I appoint my son Alfred Branch Campbell and my friend John Archibald Aitken of Sydney in the said Colony Solicitor (hereinafter called "my Trustees") to be the Executors and Trustees of this my Will I direct my Trustees to pay all my just debts funeral and testamentary expenses I give and bequeath all my jewellery plate linen china glass books pictures furniture and other household effects to my daughter Elizabeth Campbell absolutely I give devise and bequeath all my real estate and the residue of my personal estate unto my Trustees Upon trust that my Trustees shall sell convey call in and convert into money the same or such part thereof as shall not consist of money and shall with and out of the moneys produced by such sale calling in and conversion and with and out of my ready money pay my funeral and Testamentary expenses and debts and shall invest the residue of the said moneys with power for my Trustees from time to time to vary such investments And shall stand possessed of the said residuary trust moneys and the investments for the time being representing the same (hereinafter called the residuary trust funds) Upon the trusts following (that is to say) In trust to pay the income thereof

to my said Daughter Elizabeth Campbell, during her life and
from and after her decease In trust for such of my Sons who
shall survive my said Daughter (and if more than one in
equal shares) absolutely And I declare that the share of my
said Daughter under this my Will shall be for her sole and
separate use and benefit And I also declare that the receipt
in writing of my Trustees for any money securities or other
personal property payable transferable or deliverable to them
under any trust or power contained in this my Will shall
be a sufficient discharge for the same and shall effectually
exonerate the person or persons paying transferring or delivering
the same from seeing to the application or being answerable
for any loss or misapplication thereof And I also declare
that the power of appointing new trustees conferred by
Statute shall for the purposes of this my Will be vested in
the continuing Trustee for the time being of this my Will
or if there shall be no continuing trustee then in the retiring
or retiring trustees or trustee or the executor or administra-
tors of the last acting trustee And lastly I declare that
the said John Archibald Aitken shall be entitled to charge
my Estate for all business done by him in relation to my
Estate or the trusts of this my Will in the same manner
as he would have been entitled to charge my Executors and
Trustees for the same if he had not been himself an Executor
or Trustee but had been employed by my Executors and Trustees
to do such business as their Solicitors In Witness whereof
